Dear Senator Morrison, Senator Gillespie, Senator Fine, Representative Lilly, Representative Moeller, and Representative LaPointe,

The purpose of this letter is to respectfully urge you to work together to convene a public joint, bi-cameral hearing of the House and Senate's Health and Human Services Committee and Health and Human Services Appropriations Committee and the Senate's Behavioral and Mental Health Committee. The undersigned members of the Republican Caucuses of the Illinois House and Senate have serious concerns and many questions that we wish to ask regarding disturbing reports of neglect and abuse of the residents of Choate Mental Health and Developmental Center.

In a report published by ProPublica on February 10, 2023, we learned that multiple investigations by the Inspector General designated to oversee the Illinois Department of Human Services revealed serious and unacceptable incidents of neglect and abuse and a culture of intimidation and retaliation against whistleblowers.

We are aware that Choate Mental Health and Development Center has been the subject of more than 1500 complaints to the Illinois Department of Human Services spanning the last decade. We are also keenly aware that the problems at Choate have spanned multiple DHS directors and multiple gubernatorial administrations. Our concern in this matter is for the dignity, safety, and well-being of the 270 residents of Choate that suffer from the most profound developmental and mental disabilities in the state. Our concern is far from political.

We fear for the safety of the residents, staff, and administration at Choate if steps are not taken to improve conditions and to reform and eliminate an insidious "cover-up" culture that was vividly detailed in the ProPublica article referenced above.

It is our sincere hope that as the chairpersons of the House and Senate Committees charged with the duty of overseeing the operations of and funding for the State of Illinois' various mental health facilities, you would act with urgency in cooperation with us to get to the bottom of, and eventually solve, the many problems at Choate Mental Health and Developmental Center.

It is vital that we address these issues immediately so that this critical facility can continue to serve the 270 residents who depend on it. This is their home. We cannot displace these vulnerable individuals because for many of them this is their last resort. The state of Illinois has a duty to them. They deserve better, their families deserve better, and the staff that serves them deserve better.

To reiterate our specific request, we urge you to please convene, at the earliest time of convenience, a public joint committee hearing of the House and Senate's Human Services and Human Services Appropriations Committees, in person, in Springfield.

Additionally, we request the presence of any high-ranking member of the Pritzker administration that is charged with overseeing the Department of Human Services, the presence of Illinois Department of Human Services Director Grace B. Hou, and the presence of all appropriate and relevant high-level staff members of Choate Mental Health and Developmental Center, including, but not limited to the current chief administrator of the facility, Mr. Bryant Davis.

The favor of a timely response to our request is greatly appreciated. The undersigned members of the House and Senate stand ready to answer your questions and to work cooperatively to ensure this meeting happens, and that ultimately, the residents of Choate Mental Health and Developmental Center and their families are better protected and better served.
